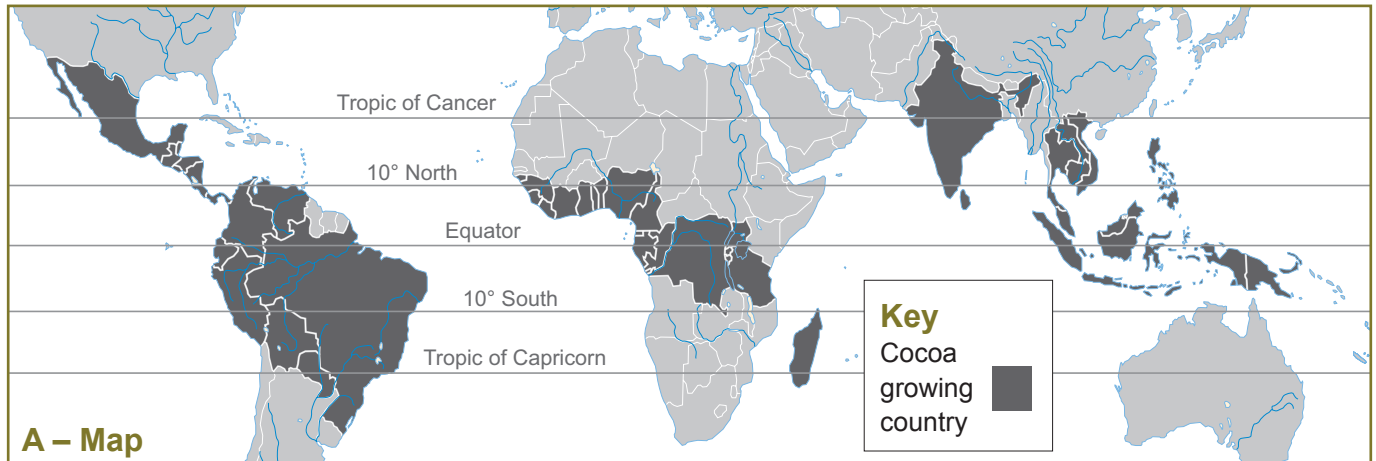

You will need an atlas to help you with the questions on this worksheet. Write the answers in your exercise book.

- 1 Map A shows the cocoa growing countries. (Ghana is not the only one!)
 - a. What pattern do you notice, about their location?
 - b. See if you can explain this pattern. Table B will help!
 - c. Cocoa isn't grown throughout the whole of each cocoa-growing country. Why not?
 - d. No cocoa is grown in the UK. Why not?
- 2 From the map, see if you can name:
 - a. Five African countries
 - b. Four Asian countries
 - c. Four South American countries that grow cocoa.
- 3 Some countries grow lots of cocoa, some only a little. Table C shows data for one recent year.
 - Draw a bar chart for this data.
 - On your bar chart, show the countries in order of their share, largest share first.
 - Use one colour for the bars for the named African countries, another colour for the Asian ones, and so on. (Give 'Others' its own colour.)
 - Add a colour key, and give your graph a title.
- 4
 - a. Which country produces most cocoa?
 - b. Which continent produces most?

B – Conditions for growing cocoa

- Mostly grows within 10° latitude of the equator
- Max. annual average temperature: 30–32°C
- Min. annual average temperature: 18–21°C
- Rainfall: 1500–2000 mm / year
- Humidity: High
- Light: Grows best in shade (its natural home is the under-canopy in the rainforest)
